Talking to Teens about College & Careers

Encouraging conversations about college and career preparation is crucial for a young person's future. These conversations should focus on the youth's goals, strengths and interests. An interest survey can be a great way to start brainstorming (see the link to the right).

Assisting with **research** can be incredibly helpful to a youth. Help youth determine what certifications, licensures or degrees are needed for careers of interest. Use the Training Finder (resource link below) to explore and find training and career preparation in the area. Use the chart below to broaden their understanding of the differences between college degrees, certifications and other career preparation options. Facilitating these conversations can be incredibly consequential to the direction of a young person's life.

Find the training option that best meets your career needs.

What kind of training will help you most? That may depend on your goals or experience, how much the training costs, or how much time you have available. Review the chart below to broaden your understanding of career preparation options.

Education/Training	What's this?	How long will it take?	How will it help me?
High school equivalency	An alternative to a high school diploma, usually earned by taking the GED or another approved exam	Test: usually 1 day Prep: as long as you need	Qualify for many jobs Qualify to enter college or training program
Adult Basic Education	Usually free classes in basic skills, English as a second language, life skills, and more	1 month to ongoing	Learn English or improve literacy Brush up math, computer, work readiness Improve entry-level job prospects
Short-term training	Short classes offered through community organizations or programs at schools that last two years or less	1 session to 2 years	Learn or refresh skills such as software, business, language, or others Qualify for many jobs Advance in a career
College Degree	A credential you earn by completing a 2-or 4-year program at a public or private college or university	2 to 4 years	Required for many professional careers Advance in a career
Certification	A credential that you earn by taking a test to prove your knowledge or skills	Test: 1 day May require work experience and/or training	Meet job requirements or preferences Stay competitive in your field
Apprenticeship	A formal combination of training and full-time paid job. Offered for hundreds of occupations through employers, unions and associations.	1 to 6 years	 Enter a high-skills, high-pay field Train while earning wages
Internship	Formal on-the-job training, usually unpaid	1 month to 1 year	Gain work experience and contacts to help break into a field Explore a career of interest


